YEMEN

ORLDS WORST



The humanitarian situation in Yemen has deteriorated further in 2020, driven by a volatile climate, economic crisis and COVID-19. With more than 24 million people, approximately 80 per cent of the country's population in need of support or humanitarian aid. Yemen remains the world's worst humanitarian crisis. Over 156,000 people have been displaced this year alone, adding to the 3.6 million existing internally displaced persons (IDPs).

YEMEN



Have you ever had to choose between feeding your family, buying baby items or taking care of your health? This is the dilemma mothers in Yemen face every day. The economic collapse and restrictions on imports have resulted in rapidly rising prices food and other basic everyday essentials.



One Nation are delivering essential baby packs consisting of baby milk, clean water, baby bottles, nappies, wipes and sanitary towels. They also receive a food parcel and a medical aid voucher.

The war destroyed our future

A mother in Yemen

"Price increases because of the war make it very difficult for me to secure basic [items] for my children... I t my children were getting sick because they didn't get enough food."

'We witnessed death'

"We used to escape the shelling by hiding in the roots of the trees, airstrikes above us, rockets in front of us... My children used to get up at night screaming in fear... I used to dream of having my own house... the war destroyed our dreams and [our] future. Now I only dream of peace and safety."

PAKISTAN

EARTHQUAKE HITS AZAD KASHMIR

The 2019 Kashmir earthquake struck regions of Pakistan, Azad Kashmir being the epicentre on the 24th of September. There was severe damage in Mirpur District, 40 people died and at least 850 were injured. Over 7000 homes were damaged leaving many families homeless.







OUR TEAM RESPONDED QUICKLY

Our team responded quickly and arrived in Pakistan on the 5th of October 2019. The team travelled to the affected areas and conducted needs assessments to discover the extent of the damage, which areas were most affected and a list of beneficiaries.

- Rebuilt 5 homes
- Completed 1 borehole for clean water
- Food parcel distributions.

THE DAMAGE WAS VERY SEVERE

We met many people who lost family members as a result of the earthquake, many were left homeless and without any support. One of our projects was to reconstruct damaged homes. We distributed food parcels to the needy, provided a water pump supplying clean water which was desperately needed in a village in Azad Kashmir.

FLOOD RELIEF - KARACHI & MUZAFFARABAD — SEPT 2020

Thunderstorms, heavy rains and flash urban flooding in Karachi and Muzaffarabad paralysed the metropolitan cities. Parts of Karachi were badly affected and were among the worst ever seen for many decades. Local families were in dire need of assistance. One Nation delivered food aid, hygiene and household items to those in need.

Homes 4 Syria

In early 2020, more than a million people were internally displaced from areas in and around Idlib. People were found sleeping rough in fields, forests, or residing in cramped, dirty refugee camps.

With your donations and amazing support, our teams started building 2-bedroom emergency homes for the displaced people. In the past few months, families have started moving in providing shelter, dignity, and privacy.

This is an ongoing project as thousands of families are still homeless. Please continue your support.

Feed daily - Daily Sadaqah

We are now delivering daily hot nutritious meals to the vulnerable and those most in need every day. Our teams visited different areas of Idlib ensuring we reached as many people as we possibly could.



Umm Ahmed:

"I am a widow from Homs with three children. I was living in my own house when the bombing started on our village and we had to flee from Idlib. We started living in a village called Marrat al Nouman but had to flee once again.

We made it safely to the borders and stopped at a makeshift camp which was housing hundreds of people. Although we were safe from the regime, the living conditions were very bad. Two of my children had fallen sick because of the cold and the harsh conditions. We were sharing a tent with six families with barely any food and water and no toilets. In the winter, when it rained the water would come into my tent.

Then One Nation charity came to the camp and offered us a house. We are very grateful for those who have made this possible, we ask Allah to reward them in this world and the next. If only they knew the big difference they've made to our lives".

Containers

We have sent 196 containers to those in need around the world. That would be an astounding 1.5 miles in container lengths, approx. 3,000,000 kg of aid with 100,000's of beneficiaries receiving aid. Not only have we supported those in need, but we have had local communities and groups coming together to collect aid. People from different faiths collecting aid from Mosques, Synagogues, Churches, Community centres and other various storage sites.

We are humbled and would like to thank everyone who have come together for those in need and helped make this a success.

Humanitarian Aid & Emergencies

Emergency

Delhi - March 2020

Over 40 people were killed and hundreds were injured as rioters destroyed Muslim owned shops and homes in northeast Delhi.

Our team delivered food, household items and medical aid to assist the victims.

Sudan floods

Devastating floods across 16 states left thousands needing urgent assistance. Over 500,000 people were affected and over 100,000 homes destroyed. One Nation team delivered food, blankets, sleeping mats, water cans and mosquito nets to the affected families in Khartoum and Kassala.

Afghanistan floods

Heavy flooding in Afghanistan left thousands displaced and in need of urgent assistance. The One Nation team delivered Emergency aid packs consisting of food, water, hygiene kits and household items.

Beirut

A huge explosion devastated the port area of the capital Beirut. The blast killed over 100 people and injured over 4,000. Our team supported the affected people by providing food aid and clean water.

Rohingya

Since August 2017, more than a million Rohingya refugees from Myanmar have fled to Bangladesh. They live in the world's largest refugee camp in Kutupalong. We deliver monthly food aid; build hand pumps, deep bore water wells, masajid and shelters...

Gaza

We distribute monthly food aid, food aid to the widows, clean water, medical aid and orphan sponsorship. Donated an ambulance to the Ministry of Health, helping to save lives every day.

Palestine

We constructed an additional classroom to Noor Al-Huda School & Welfare in Shuafat Camp, Jerusalem. This will help to provide facilities for an extra 30 students.



Uyghur refugees in Turkey

Having escaped extreme hardship, thousands of Chinese Uyghur men, women and children are rebuilding their lives in Turkey. Our team deliver regular monthly food parcels to these refugees.

Ramadan 2020

With your help, we were able to provide relief and serve the Ummah across the globe to over 500,000 beneficiaries. We also distributed your Sadaqtul Fitr and provided Eid gifts to children.

Gaza water desalination project

One Nation installed a water desalination plant in Gaza, which was donated by 'Muslims of Huddersfield'. The desalination plant was installed in the Aldura Hospital and is providing clean drinking water to the following -

- The patients residing in hospital
- The doctors and surgical operations rooms
- The community served by the hospital
- The visitors to the hospital
- 300 500 persons per day
- 30,000 litres of clean water per day

India - Medical camp for Kidney patients

Due to the high costs of surgical operations and medicines, the poor are unable to get treatment and are forced to live in pain. Many individuals are unable to travel and reach hospitals, resulting in deterioration of their health.

One Nation set up a medical camp in Deoband, India for Kidney patients which helped to provide free treatment to 200 patients.

India - Cataract operations

This project aimed to improve the vision of poor individuals in India who have blurry vision and require an eye cataract surgery for recovery of eyesight. Our team organized 50 eye cataract surgeries to patients in need.



Over £200,000 of donations for prosthetic parts.

The center provides a high quality prosthetic limb. Sadly, many of these patients are children. With your help and donations, PALS clinic has helped over 200 patients in the last year, bringing them closer to a normal life again.

Omar Bakri (Idlib) 'I am 26 years old and I lost my leg 3 years ago. I was in the market doing my shopping and suddenly we heard the sirens in the market go off signalling that there were war jets in the skies. People were panicking and running around trying to seek shelter under buildings nearby, as I was running to safety the area I was in was suddenly filled with smoke. The airstrike had hit me: I could hear screams as the smoke slowly started to clear.

I felt that I had been hit in my leg, it was shrapnel which tore through my leg. I sustained my wounds on right leg and I was unable to move. After some while I was rescued and taken to the nearest hospital, I had fallen unconscious because of losing a lot of blood.

I woke up in the ICU room after I had been operated on, I had my leg amputated as there was no other solution in saving it. I spent the next few months recovering and waiting for the wounds in my leg to close. After losing my leg it felt my life had come to an end'.

Alhamdulillah PALS were able to help me by fitting a prosthetic limb and helping me with rehabilitation to walk again. I am now able to do things I couldn't do before.

Syria Hospitals

One Nation provided over £300,000 of medical

One of our biggest achievements last year was establishing the main surgical hospital in Idlib called Al-Shifa hospital, this has now got the best intensive care unit in Northern Idlib. We are supporting the running of all the surgical fields, recently opening an internal medical department. With your continued support we have provided this hospital with all the medical equipment. This will help save lives every day!

EDUCATION & DEVELOPMENT

One Nation School - Idlib, Syria

The One Nation school has now been running for 3 years and It began with only 90 orphans. It is now providing quality education to nearly 400 students, the majority of whom are orphans and displaced. The school has become a vital part of the community as it has become known for its hospitality and care towards children who have been through a decade of war. At the school, students are studying a full curriculum that aims to give them the academic tools they need to excel and continue their education as adults.

Women's empowerment centre in Syria

The One Nation Empowerment centre offers courses such as first aid, knitting, basic healthcare, art, reading and writing, Quran and much more. Many have graduated through these courses and found jobs so they can now support their families.

Hafiz in Syria

Since 2015, the Hafiz in Syria sponsorship programme has successfully sponsored over 300 displaced and deprived students attending institutes in various camps and rural areas throughout Syria.

Our team of qualified staff, supervise the project on a daily basis while our administrative field team conducts monthly visits to each institute.

Every six months an overview of the student's progression, along with their profile and case history is provided and once a year an annual report is prepared. This past year we have had the honour to record the graduation of 26 new Hafiz of Quran and hope to exceed those numbers of graduates in the years to come.

Orphans

Decades of war has left millions of children orphaned and in hardship. One Nation aims to improve lives of many of the most vulnerable by providing economical support, educational and rehabilitative activities. We aim to give the care and attention every child deserves and needs.

One Nation village in Syria

The One Nation Village in the north of Idlib has been an amazing project. The residential village where the widows and orphans reside consists of two residential blocks, each block consists of 35 families. The village aims to provide them with the necessary education and training to achieve their dreams and aspirations and look forward to a brighter future.

The complex includes Masjid Ali Banat, The Salah Al-Din Al-Ayubbi Gym, 'Project Hope', Emergency shelter tents, a nursery and day care centre, the Al-Mumtahina Education Institute and more.

COVID-19 PANDEMIC

UK response

The corona-virus (COVID-19) pandemic hit the UK in early 2020 and caused unprecedented damage to not only people's health but also livelihoods. As the UK went into lock down, hospitals were filling up with patients, many of the elderly were self- isolating and thousands had lost their jobs. Vulnerable people have been hit the hardest by the outbreak and it has driven families deeper into hunger and poverty, having a major impact on people's mental health.

One Nation responded to the crisis across the UK working alongside local councils, organisations and food banks by providing essential support to the elderly and most vulnerable.

Global response

As Covid-19 cases increased across the globe, our teams stepped up our efforts to assist the most vulnerable. Thousands of people across the globe in countries such as Pakistan, India and Bangladesh, rely on a daily income, also known as "daily wagers". These people lost their jobs overnight leaving them and their families homeless and without food. We responded by delivering food aid, Hygiene Kits, Covid test kits and other medical assistance to over 20 countries across Europe, Asia and Africa.

IMPACT AFRICA

MALAWI

In Makalani village, we completed our first borehole and house construction. We also distributed food packs and farmer packs which consisted of essential food items and supplies to provide enough crops for an entire year. A great initiative we took in the area was planting trees that would help in eradicating viruses caused by water contamination in the streams.

Thousands of Malawians live in such conditions that they can't afford to pay for their medical needs. We visited the Lions Eye Clinic in the Queen Elizabeth Central Hospital where we had the opportunity to witness numerous cataract surgeries. We heard many touching stories, however, a story of a 90-year-old lady who has not been able to see for over 20 years really touched us. She told us "the first thing I would like to see is my children and grandchildren".

We visited irrigation systems in Nusondu village in order to understand the benefits and how they worked. People of the village explained how the irrigation systems have changed their lives. Without the irrigation system, the villagers would have to wait for rain to water their crops, which meant they would have very little during the summer months. With the new system, they have water all year round. Listening to the feedback gave us the understanding on how we take water for granted and how much of a blessing it is.

VISITING SCHOOLS

Visiting Ntonda School was a heart-breaking experience. We were shocked to hear that many students walked 3.5km without any shoes to reach school! their only meal of the day was a small cup of porridge. With your help and support we managed to provide hot meals and school packs for the students.

Our time in Malawi gave us an understanding and appreciation of the blessings we have and not to take them for granted.


We are now working in over 15 countries in Africa providing food aid, clean water, education and setting up self-sustainable projects.

This initiative began in April 2019. Providing a safe space for women to:

- Donate to the One Nation charity.
- Volunteer for the charity, we've had volunteers with a range of abilities use their talents to help and support our charity and its projects locally and abroad.
- Share ideas to benefit our local community and or those in need abroad.
- Find out about the One Nation charity
- Get involved in our events, we've had some great events bringing the women of the local community together to help and support the most poor and vulnerable.

We held events and raised awareness of and or raised funds for:

- Emergency shelters in Syria, providing families who were displaced and sleeping outside to have a safe place to stay.
- High Desi Tea Launch Event with Yvonne Ridley who gave her eye witness account of our great work in Syria.
- On International Women's Day we welcomed Razan Al Sous to hear her inspiring story having escaped from Syria with her family as refugees. We raised money for emergencies homes in Syria, brick houses to house the displaced, over £16,000 which means 32

- houses being built in Syria for families who have lost so much.
- In January and February, we hosted four events with Happy Moments for women in the local area, having conducted a survey to ascertain the concerns of women in the local area. We invited local organisations who provided support in the four key areas we identified: health, mental health, financial issues and employment, we held the events at Kick Off with personal trainers and sports professionals to run sports workshops.
- We supported students from Batley Girls school with their Enactus fundraising project for Holiday Hunger. They came overall second from the schools and won a community award.
- We held Eid parties for women and children so they could celebrate Eid and also raise money for important projects like water in Yemen.
- We held a sports tournament for women with the proceeds raised being donated to PALS.
- We got involved with delivering hot meals to those isolating.
- We had a sisters' step challenge which raised over £10,000 in a short period for our Winter Appeal, meaning over 100 families would receive a full Winter pack.



WHATS NEXT?

In our 7th Year, we are now working in over 40 countries providing food, water, shelter, education and self-sustainable projects. We are continuing our efforts in Asia, Middle East and Europe, with the aim to expand our work in Africa and South America.

Sub-Saharan Africa is a region with the largest number of people living in extreme poverty, with 413 million people living on less than \$1.90 per day. 22.8% of the population is undernourished, the highest prevalence of all regions in the world. We aim to build to orphanages and educational centres.

We are also delivering nutritious school meals for children across Africa in countries such as Sudan, Zambia, Sierra Leone and Kenya, Each school meals only costs £1 each. The impact of your donation will not only support a family through the struggle of feeding their children, but will help give tens of thousands of children across Africa a better start to the day, a better start in life.

Muslim communities in South America are growing with an estimated population of 1.5 million. These communities are in need of support. We aim to provide food aid, education and long term projects.

We are purchasing dates from Palestinian farmers in Jericho. This is part of our self-sustaining project in Palestine, providing Palestinian farmers with an income to support their families, on a larger scale helping the economy to grow and prosper.
